SCHEDULE CHANGES

Drop/add activity may be done using web-based registration. After full term drop/add period ends, all other changes must be completed using a Schedule Change Form available at One Stop or Academic Records. COURSES MAY NOT BE ADDED AFTER THE DROP/ADD PERIOD unless it is an Abbreviated Session II course. Students may elect to change to or from the Pass/No Pass grade mode until the end of the FINAL DROP DATE for the session in which the course takes place.

EXTRA HOURS

The excess hour tuition charge applies to each hour over 18. The Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs must approve more than 18 hours. Generally, extra hours are approved only if the student earned at least B-average grades in the previous term.

COURSES BY APPOINTMENT AND INDEPENDENT STUDY

Signed requests for Fall 2025 Course by Appointment or Independent Study are due to the Student One Stop Center by the end of first day of the Fall 2025 semester (Monday, August 18th, 2025, 5:00 PM).

SCHEDULE AND CATALOG NOTATIONS

Global courses include a "G" after the section number (i.e., AR 330 M1 G). Writing Intensive courses appear on the class schedule and on the WC Portal Course Schedule with a "W" after the section number (i.e., AG 362 M1 W). Courses that have been approved for the Race, Gender, and Ethnicity minor are notated as such on the schedule, either with an "R" next to it, with a comment underneath it, or both. Students must meet the requirements for graduation as described in a single catalog, usually dated with their year of entrance. An extensive explanation of degree requirements, including general education, can be found in the Wilmington College catalog designated as the student's degree catalog on the Major Declaration form.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

Wilmington College reserves the right to cancel any 100- or 200-level course or section if the number of students registered for it at the registration period is less than 10 or 75% of capacity, whichever is smaller; the College reserves the right to cancel any 300- or 400-level course if fewer than 7 students are registered. For 4 semester hour classes, class periods are 60 minutes in length on M-W-F and 90

minutes on T-R. Laboratories for most sciences and agriculture require two to three hours weekly. All other laboratory times vary based on the discipline and course requirements.
